Chromebooks - Mobile Guardian

Year 7 to Year 11 students have been using Chromebooks for the last year and we are now making a very important change to their use. Starting now there will be the following changes:

- 1. The Chromebooks will all be automatically adjusted so they only work from 7am to 10pm.
- 2. The internet access will be to authorised sites ONLY.
- In class, teachers will be able to track what students are doing on their devices as well as automatically turn them off or limit what they do.

These important security changes will provide even better security for the students without impacting on their learning.

Psychology Lessons

We are disappointed to announce that Miss Tonner, the Psychology Teacher will be leaving next week as she wishes to prioritise her Master's Degree studies. I would like to thank her for the work she has done with the Year 10 to year 13 students over the last term and we wish her well for the future.

I am, however, delighted to say we have been able to find an excellent replacement! I will be able to make a formal announcement soon but the new teacher will be able to start online lessons immediately and will arrive in school as soon as the visa paperwork is complete. We are delighted with this appointment and I look forward to sharing more information with you soon.


ECAP NEWS






KSI GARDEN PLAN



LANGUAGE DEPARTMENT

Language of the month

At the end of last term we celebrated Japanese as our language of the month. We began with assemblies, learning about the Japanese language and the culture of Japanese speakers. We learnt, for example, that 128 million people speak Japanese as a first language and that Japanese uses three scripts: hiragana, katakana, and kanji. We also discovered that Japan is an archipelago, has five main islands (Hokkaido, Honshu,



Kyushu, Shikoku and Okinawa) and that Japan has the sixth longest coastline in the world at 29,751 km. We also talked about Mt Fuji, the Pacific ring of fire, wagyu, tempura, sumo and manga! Finally we leant how to say some things in Japanese. (For example おはようOhayō andきょうならSayōnara!) A really big thank you to Kenji, who gave some fantastic assemblies explaining his experience of speaking Japanese, well done! In January we are celebrating Turkish!
