YEAR 5


It's good to be back! We hope you all had a great Easter break. The children have come back well rested and ready to start our final term together in Year 5.

April 21: We celebrate Sant Jordi

On April 21st we will celebrate Sant Jordi, the Catalan festival of the rose and the book, by offering workshops, readings and various literary events to all our students.

During the previous week, from April 11 to 14, our students have participated in the literary contest, *Jocs Florals*, and have written texts (poetry and narration) of free theme, but that had to respond to the sub-theme Emotions (primary students) and Identity (secondary students). On Friday, April 21, prizes will be awarded to the finalists and winners in each category.

Throughout the day there will be sale of roses and secondhand books, various workshops (creation of a dragon mask in EYFS, solidarity bookmarks in primary school, or TikTokers workshop in KS3). In addition,



we have prepared a nice and comfortable reading space outside and in the school tent to share stories and do readings in different languages. At 11 am, we will be visited by the Colla Castellera de Gavà, who will offer a workshop to learn how to make "castells", a tradition of Catalan origin, which consists in the construction of human towers, and promotes teamwork and solidarity. To end the day, EYFS and primary students will parade with their costumes of the characteristic characters of Sant Jordi.
