Y11 - History

History Project "History Lessons: Tell Me!" in which the students had to, based on the guidelines given in class, plan a script, interview someone who had lived through the Franco time (directly or indirectly).

The goal of the project:

The historical memory of the Second Republic, the Spanish Civil War and the Franco regime is becoming smaller and will disappear. With this project we try to collect as many testimonies as possible and make their experiences known in a didactic way through an online blog.

To do this, in the first phase, we established working groups and studied the historical context through small exercises and/or mini research projects. This first phase allowed students not only to better understand the events that took place

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during that time, but also to reflect on their causes and consequences.

Once this first part was completed, each group had to locate witnesses who had directly or indirectly lived through the Franco era. The next step was to write a script for each witness and thus be able to interview them. Finally, each group wrote an article with the main conclusions of their interviews and made a short documentary with the aspects they considered most important.
