What a pleasure it is to write to you at the start of this new term! We opened our doors a week ago and we have had seven wonderful days with lively excitable children eager to learn.

I would like to say a particular welcome to all of our new families - it is a privilege for us that you have chosen BCG for your children's education and I can assure you that we will do everything we can to ensure they are happy in our community.

Our new staff have settled in very well too and all tell me how much they enjoy teaching their classes! Students have already been using the library, the science laboratories are being used all day long and we can hear the new year 7 and 8 choir as we walk down the corridors towards the auditorium. Early Years and Primary wasted no time, and the children were eagerly learning new things from day one.

Clearly everyone is delighted to be back in school.

Our COVID-19 procedures have been working very well within school although I would ask that parents take a little more care at afternoon pickup as it is difficult for us to manage what happens outside the gates - we really need your full cooperation so we can keep everyone safe.

This week we had the first assemblies of the year. On Tuesday I addressed the whole Secondary School and explained my thoughts on the importance of us building and maintaining a strong academic culture across the school. I would like to share some of the salient points with you here.

Whilst moving around school, all students should:

- Be courteous and well behaved
- Say good morning to cleaners, teachers, kitchen staff etc
- Be very aware of their COVID responsibilities

In class, students should:

- Arrive on time a fully equipped for each lesson
- Take an active part in class discussions
- Ask questions if they do not understand
- Listen to other students and share their thoughts in a respectful manner
- Be prepared to make mistakes and learn from them
- Understand that they need to work hard if they are to succeed

At home, students should:

- Have an appropriate place to do their homework
- Do the homework according to the Homework timetable
- Turn off mobile phones until they have completed all their work
- Read a book in English, each evening

There was already a very positive attitude from students this week, which was wonderful to see. We want your children to achieve their very best and I ask that we can have your support by ensuring your children arrive at school on time and have an appropriate place at home for their homework. Children in year 10 and above should, ideally, have their own desk for studying.

Home Learning.

We have reviewed our home learning policy and I will be publishing a new one next week. Homework is an extremely important part of the education of your child as it is the one opportunity they have to develop and improve their independent learning skills.

Every year at school builds upon the last and students need to reach a point where they have acquired all the skills and knowledge to pass their exams and get into the university of their choice. Many of you will be hoping for your children to go to leading universities and that is very realistic for many students but it requires hard work and commitment from an early age. We will be setting home learning as follows:

- **Year 7** - 1 hour per night
- **Year 8** - 1 hour per night
- **Year 9** - 1 hour per night
- **Year 10** - 90 mins per night
- **Year 11** - 2 hrs per night

Students will also be doing after school clubs, sports etc. I appreciate that, but it is essential that they develop their academic skills to the right level if they wish to move on to a good university when they finish IB. We will be sending out Homework Timetables very soon.

It may have been a short week but it has been the usual jam packed curriculum and thoughtful lessons in each of our classes. The start of day has been excellent so thank you all very much for adhering to the rules of 1 adult only, dropping off swiftly and for being on time. Morning drop off is between 08:30-08:50 and lessons start promptly so please arrive on time. In order to improve the end of day pick-up, please make sure that once you have collected your child, you leave immediately to ensure social distancing is adhered to. The path and road should not become crowded. Once collected, children should not be playing by the gate or inside the school.

It is very important that you make every effort to collect your child on time. Our collection time is between 4.10 and 4.20pm. If you have older siblings finishing later then please arrive to collect your youngest child first. We are making every effort to maintain the safest school day possible for your child by using a bubble system, rotation of toys and extra cleaning regimes and late pick ups impact the after school duties of teachers. In some cases, this leads them to be late to collect their own children. Parents arriving late (past 4.20pm) will need to collect their child from the front steps. We want to avoid taking your child past other bubbles of children so please collect on time at the white EYFS and Lower Primary gate. 

Science at BCG

In Science, we have started Autumn term with our pupils working hard. Those entering new Keystages (Year 7 and Year 10) have completed their baseline assessments with a positive attitude and an open mind. As teachers, we now have a much better idea of your child's pre-existing knowledge and skillset. Moving forward, we are well placed to support and develop your child's learning.

In Year 7, pupils have been learning about the cells, tissues, organs in relation to the organisation of an animal. In Year 8, pupils have been introduced to the topic of food in relation to health and the digestive system. Year 9 are learning about the differences between living things of the same species and what causes those differences. KS4 classes have started / continued with their iGCSE content in their respective disciplines. Our new KS5 classes in all three disciplines have kicked off to a flying start, learning about atoms, biological molecules and momentum.

All science classes are now taking place in the new, spacious and wonderfully equipped laboratories and some classes have already started taking part in individual practical activities. We have a busy Autumn term ahead but are very happy to be back teaching and seeing those moments of learning in your children's eyes!


